SUBJECT: Cinemark USA, Inc. – (Proposed) Final Judgment Pursuant to Stipulation, April 25, 2012

Enclosed is a (Proposed) Final Judgment Pursuant to Stipulation issued by the District Attorney's Office of Solano County filed against Cinemark USA, Inc., dba Century Theatres on April 25, 2012 for failure to redeem for cash or check any gift certificate or gift card with a cash value of less than ten dollars in accordance with California Civil Code Section 1749.5 (b) (2).

Cinemark USA, Inc., dba Century Theatres was assessed civil penalties, investigative cost recovery, and *cy pres* of \$60,000. Civil penalties amounted to \$28,213; *cy pres* restitution amounted to \$10,000; agency and prosecution costs were \$21,392; and \$395 were for court fees. *Cy Pres* of \$10,000 will be evenly distributed between the Consumer Trust Fund of Solano County Department of Agriculture/Weights and Measures and the Consumer Trust Fund of Shasta County Department of Agriculture/Weights and Measures.

Solano County should be sure to report these penalties in the County Monthly Report. All participating counties should separately record their individual investigative cost reimbursements in the appropriate columns in the report.

We appreciate the fine work done by the Solano County District Attorney's Office along with the State and county investigators that documented and caused to be prosecuted these violations. Jurisdiction is retained for the purpose of enabling any party to the Stipulated Final Judgment to apply to the Court for such further orders and directions as may be necessary and 19 appropriate for the construction and carrying out of the Stipulated Final Judgment, for the 20 modification or dissolution of any injunctive provisions hereof, for enforcement of compliance 21 22 herewith, or for the punishment of violations hereof. 11. This Judgment has been reviewed by the Court, and based upon the representations of the 23 parties, the Court finds that it has been entered in good faith and is, in all respects, fair, just, and 24 equitable to protect the public and the individuals who may have been affected by the issues 25 26 related as more fully described in the Complaint. 12. The parties waive the right to appeal this Judgment both as to form and content and the 27 28 serving and filing of a notice of Entry of Judgment.
