ITEM 1: INTRODUCTIONS

The meeting was called to order at 10:00 a.m. and a quorum was established.

ITEM 2: ELECTION OF OFFICERS

MOTION: Dr. Sean Swezey moved to conduct open nominations. Mr. Steve DeMuri seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

Dr. Swezey nominated Mr. John Ashby for Chair. Mr. Ashby nominated Ms. Melody Meyer for Chair. Ms. Meyer nominated Dr. Swezey for Chair.

MOTION: Mr. David Will moved to close nominations. Mr. Gary Edwards seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

MOTION: Dr. Karen Klonsky moved to appoint the individual receiving the second most votes as Vice Chair. Mr. DeMuri seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

Committee members voted by written ballot and elected the following officers:

ITEM 3: APPROVAL OF MEETING MINUTES

MOTION: Mr. Blake Alexandre moved to approve the January 24, 2008 Meeting Minutes as amended. Ms. Julie Spandow seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

A copy of the January 24, 2008 Meeting Minutes are attached as EXHIBIT A.

ITEM 4: CDFA UPDATES (LBAM)

Mr. Nate Dechoretz provided an update on the Light Brown Apple Moth (LBAM). The implications to commerce may be very high considering that the LBAM does not have any natural predators that are native to California. The major issue guiding LBAM is the recent court decision in Santa Cruz that required CDFA to fully comply with the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) in developing an environmental impact report. CDFA continues to battle misinformation in regards to the terminology used for LBAM pheromones. Mr. Dechoretz conveyed that CDFA's primary goal is to avoid the use of hard pesticides to eradicate the LBAM. There have been a number of bills introduced in the legislature related to invasive species. The Committee subsequently discussed issues related to pending invasive species legislation.

ITEM 5: ORGANIC PROGRAM REPORTS

Mr. Rick Jensen provided an update for the Inspection and Compliance Branch. In December 2006, a complaint was received by CDFA alleging that a fertilizer product being sold as organic was not compliant. The Inspection Services Division, Fertilizer Program conducted an investigation and found that the fertilizer product was mislabeled and misrepresented. The Department took action against the company found in violation and required the company to remove the registration, recall the product, and notify its customers/purchasers of the endeavor. Subsequently, the Fertilizer Program continued to closely monitor the company found in violation in an effort to determine that it was in compliance with the Department's order and to ensure that it remained in compliance. CDFA considers the case closed and has not found further violations with the offending party.

The Committee subsequently discussed enforcement activities related to the organic industry. Mr. Ray Green announced that the Organic Program will be working with the

Fertilizer Program to determine the feasibility of implementing a civil penalty matrix for fertilizer mislabeling and misrepresentation. As CDFA continues to review the Organic Program, regulations will likely be needed to identify processes authorized within the organic law in order to further the activities and goals of the Organic Program.

A. Budget Update

Mr. Green provided an update on the Organic Program budget. The Organic Program is anticipating total program costs in the amount of \$1,203,636 for Fiscal Year (FY) 2008/09.

MOTION: Mr. Alexandre moved to approve the proposed 2008/09 FY Organic Program Budget as submitted. Mr. Garff Hathcock seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

B. Status of Appeals Procedures

Mr. Green provided an update on the status of the appeals process. CDFA's appeals process and procedures are in place and available for review on the CDFA website. In addition, an information guide was distributed to individuals that attended the organic training sessions and is available on the CDFA website.

C. Organic Program Enforcement Update

Mr. Dave Carlson provided an enforcement update for the Organic Program. Eight complaints were held over from 2007 and 14 new complaints were registered from January to May 2008. The Committee subsequently discussed issues related to the enforcement process.

Copies of the 2008 Organic Complaint Log, 2008 Audits by Counties, 2008 Organic Residue Analysis Report, FY 2007/08 Organic Program Budget, FY 2008/09 Organic Program Budget, CDFA Sources and Use Statement, and Revenue from Registrations by Month and Year are attached as Exhibits B, C, D, E, F, G, and H, respectively.

ITEM 6: MEMBER REPORTS

A. Organic Program Study – Karen Klonsky

Dr. Klonsky, Cooperative Extension Specialist, University of California, Davis, Department of Agriculture and Resource Economics, provided a report on a study funded by the University of California Sustainable Agriculture and Research Education

Program. Dr. Klonsky has been working with Mr. Green over the last several years in an effort to analyze the California Organic Program registration data. In addition to analyzing the demographics of current organic registrants, Dr. Klonsky analyzed exit and entry trends related to California Organic Program registration.

The Organic Program Study found that although the total number of organic registrants is fairly constant, there are a lot of individuals that enter and leave the program. The impetus for the study was why so many individuals were leaving the Organic Program. One of the key findings of the Organic Program Study is that only 74 percent of the organic registrants that discontinued their organic registration actually self-identified as having deregistered. Fourteen percent of the individuals that left the program stated that they were never a producer. Eight percent of the individuals that responded to the survey stated that they did not know why they deregistered. Approximately a quarter of the self-identified deregistered growers stated that they have continued to utilize organic farming methods. The Committee subsequently discussed issues related to the study and thanked Dr. Klonsky for providing a valuable resource.

B. Discussion of CDFA Board Representation of Stakeholders – Brian McElroy

Mr. Brian McElroy proposed that the California Organic Products Advisory Committee should parallel the National Organic Standards Board in its membership structure. As a result, Mr. McElroy proposed that the California Organic Products Advisory Committee should make a recommendation to the CDFA Secretary to include representation for an Accredited Stakeholder/Organic Certifier.

MOTION: Mr. Blake Alexandre moved to make a recommendation to CDFA Secretary A. G. Kawamura to create a Certifier seat and an Alternate Certifier seat on the California Organic Products Advisory Committee. Both seats shall be USDA accredited. Mr. Aaron Turner seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

C. NOSB Update – Steve DeMuri

Mr. DeMuri provided an update for the National Organic Standards Board (NOSB). NOSB has an upcoming meeting on May 20-22, 2008 in Baltimore, Maryland. Mr. DeMuri discussed particular agenda items that will be covered during the upcoming NOSB meeting. Of particular interest is the clarification of the national organic list. Currently, there is a 30 page document on the NOSB website which provides definitions for agricultural and synthetic goods.

D. Organic Press Releases – John Ashby

Mr. Ashby discussed the feasibility of forming a press committee to collect recommendations for positive press releases about the organic industry. Mr. Ashby suggested that the press committee should collect recommendations for press releases, develop a strategy for preparing organic press releases, and establish an approval process for organic press releases. Ms. Meyer stressed the need for positive press releases for the organic industry.

Mr. Dechoretz discussed CDFA's policy relating to press releases and explained that it would be possible for the Committee to submit press releases to CDFA's Office of Public Affairs for consideration.

MOTION: Dr. Swezey moved to establish a Press Committee and appoint Mr. Ashby as the Chair of the Press Committee to investigate the feasibility of providing press releases on behalf of COPAC. Mr. Ashby seconded. The motioned passed with one nay vote.

E. Organic Complaint System - John Ashby and John Foster

Mr. Ashby suggested that the California Organic Program website needs improvement in regards to the complaint process. Mr. Ashby recommended that CDFA include a frequently asked questions web link to guide individuals through the complaint process. Mr. Ashby also suggested that the California Organic Program include a statistical summary of pending and prior investigations e.g., the number of complaints filed and resolved for each year. Mr. Green stated that the Organic Program will work with CDFA information technology personnel to implement Mr. Ashby's suggestions. Mr. Turner suggested that there should be a mechanism in place to educate growers in regard to issues affecting organic rules and regulations. The members subsequently discussed issues related to enforcement and stressed the need for an efficient and comprehensive organic complaint system.

F. Farm Bill Update – Melody Meyer

Ms. Meyer provided an update on the US Farm Bill. On May 2, 2008, the House and Senate reconciled the Farm Bill and included provisions for organic funding. The Committee discussed cost share provisions in the Farm Bill for certified operations and federal funding for organic crop insurance.

ITEM 7: PUBLIC COMMENTS

There were no public comments.

ITEM 8: NEW ITEMS

The members held a general discussion about rising food costs and its impact on the organic industry.

Mr. Ashby discussed the implications associated with certifying flavors as organic.

Mr. Jake Lewin explained that the NOP provides several training sessions throughout the year in various locations along with a number of declarations that certifiers are supposed to follow.

Mr. McElroy discussed the USDA National Organic Program's pending audit of the California Organic Program. Mr. Green explained that he is expecting the USDA to notify the California Organic Program of the pending audit within the next few weeks. Mr. McElroy suggested that the Committee should consider inviting representatives from USDA-NOP to a COPAC meeting in order to increase coordination and strategic planning.

ITEM 9: ADJOURNMENT

The next meeting will be held at 10:00 a.m. on July 30, 2008 in Sacramento, CA. The meeting adjourned at 3:07 p.m.

ITEM 1: INTRODUCTIONS

The meeting was called to order at 1:07 p.m. A quorum was established and introductions were made.

ITEM 2: APPROVAL OF MINUTES

MOTION: Mr. Blake Alexandre moved to approve the October 24, 2007 Meeting Minutes as amended. Mr. John Ashby seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

A copy of the October 24, 2007 Meeting Minutes are attached as EXHIBIT A.

ITEM 3: CDFA UPDATES: LIGHT BROWN APPLE MOTH (LBAM)

Mr. Stacy Carlsen reported that the California Department of Food and Agriculture (CDFA) issued a *Questions and Answers* press release on January 23, 2008, which addresses many of the issues related to the treatment programs developed by the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) and the CDFA. The Light Brown Apple Moth Program is considered an eradication project and is being funded primarily by the federal government.

The press release identifies Monterey, Santa Cruz, San Mateo, Contra Costa, San Francisco, and Marin as infested counties subject to the proposed eradication plan. The proposal includes aerial treatment using pheromones, ground treatment using pheromones, Spinosad/Bacillus thuringiensis organic treatments for larva control, and releasing egg parasite wasps in areas with high levels of infection.

The protocol for each infected county is uncertain. Monterey and Santa Cruz counties intend to use aerial applications of pheromones due to prior experience. The USDA is experimenting with three new pheromone formulations. The eradication activities will not commence until the late summer in order to determine which application is working best and to consider the environmental impact. The pheromones do not have an impact on organic certification.

ITEM 4: ORGANIC PROGRAM REPORTS

Mr. Ray Green presented a brief history and outline of the California Organic Program. Subsequently, Mr. Green reported on the reorganization of the Organic Program. The mandate of the program is to ensure compliance with National Organic Program regulations in California. The program goals include, increasing compliance within the industry, increasing enforcement, improving the utilization of resources, and increasing industry confidence in the program.

Mr. Dave Carlson provided reports on the 2007 New Organic Program Registrations, Complaints from January 1, 2007 to December 31, 2007, County Spot Inspections for 2007, and Residue Analysis for 2007. The committee members asked Mr. Carlson to include totals as well as provide receipt and resolution dates in future complaint logs.

The committee took a ten-minute break at 2:35 p.m. and reconvened at a 2:45 p.m.

A copy of Organic Program Reorganization Update is attached as EXHIBIT C.

A copy of the Registration Form for the CDFA Organic Program is attached as EXHIBIT D.

A copy of the 2007 New Organic Program Registrations report is attached as EXHIBIT E.

ITEM 5: CALIFORNIA DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH (CDPH) REPORT – PAT KENNELLY

Mr. Pat Kennelly provided reports on organic product registrations and CDPH complaints for 2007. According to Mr. Kennelly, the estimates provided in the report are on the low side and are provided by registrants. However, the report illustrates the volume and breadth of organic products. Mr. Kennelly subsequently provided an overview of organic trends and suggested that they are moving in a positive direction.

According to Mr. Kennelly, the 2007 CDPH Complaint Log documents the types of complaints received and whether they were substantiated. Mr. Kennelly conveyed that the majority of the findings indicate that there is a correlation between misunderstanding industry guidelines and violations. The committee asked Mr. Kennelly to provide receipt and resolution dates in future complaint logs.

ITEM 6: MEMBER REPORTS

Ms. Melody Meyer reported on the status of the 2007 Farm Bill. According to Ms. Meyer, there are two versions of the 2007 Farm Bill that require US Senate and US House of Representatives reconciliation. Ms. Meyer also provided information and resources to contact elected federal representatives.

Mr. Ashby voiced concerns over non-organic foods being portrayed as organic products. Mr. Ashby is concerned that the latter mentioned phenomenon may reduce demand for organic products.

Ms. Meyer asked members to give opinions on how natural labeling may influence the organic food industry.

Ms. Julie Spandow discussed issues related to the California Organic Products Act of 2003 and restaurant menu advertising.

ITEM 7: PUBLIC COMMENTS

An unidentified member of the public explained that she received notification of the COPAC meeting a week in advance and suggested that the committee plan to notify interested parties earlier.

Ms. Gay Timmons of Organic and Sustainable Industry Standards (OASIS) invited the committee members to comment on the movement toward providing a standard definition of organic cosmetics.

ITEM 8: NEWS ITEMS

None.

ITEM 9: ADJOURNMEENT

The meeting adjourned at 3:36 p.m.
